OUR HISTORY

- In April 1962, the hospital opened its doors to the public as R.T. Jones Memorial Hospital, with 62 semi-private rooms and 17 physicians on staff.
- In October 1997, with approximately 100 physicians on staff, the hospital joined the Northside Hospital family and became Northside Hospital-Cherokee.

TODAY

- Northside Hospital-Cherokee is an 84-bed, not-for-profit, full-service community hospital, with over 300 physicians on its medical staff and more than 600 employees. More than 87,500 patients were treated in 2008.
- The 16-acre campus includes 20 emergency department treatment rooms, eight labor and delivery rooms and 16 newborn nursery bassinets. More than 1,000 deliveries were performed at Northside Hospital-Cherokee in 2008.
- The RiverStone Medical Center in Canton offers women's imaging, chest/abdominal imaging, neuroradiology, oncologic imaging and orthopedic imaging, as well as a four-bed Sleep Disorders Center.
- More than 50 physicians and practitioners are located at the Northside/Cherokee Medical Office Building in Woodstock, offering imaging and laboratory services.
- The Emergency Department cared for more than 31,000 patients in 2008.

- Northside Hospital-Cherokee recently expanded their surgical floor to include 6 operating rooms, 12 recovery rooms and 6 holding bays.
 - In early 2008, the hospital filed a Certificate-of-Need (CON) application to establish Radiation Therapy Services for cancer treatment. The project has been approved; however, it is under final review by the state.
 - The Sixes Road project is scheduled to be complete by late 2009 or early 2010. The Medical Office building will be 60,000 square feet.
